General

The following DPRC resources are available to all students, employees and visitors with disabilities at SF State:

ACCESSIBLE EVENT PLANNING

Use the DPRC checklist for planning an accessible event at SF State. The checklist, which you can download from access.sfsu.edu, is your guide to best practices in accessible event planning.

ACCESS AND CONSTRUCTION ALERTS

This includes updates on campus construction, related temporary barriers and alternate access routes via subscription email and the SF State website.

DEAF AND HARD-OF-HEARING SERVICES

Deaf and hard-of-hearing students, applicants, employees and guests have access to sign language interpretation, real-time captioning, assistive listening devices, note-taking assistance, media access and advocacy.

ON-CAMPUS CART SERVICE

Student

Students with disabilities may be eligible for one or more of the following resources depending on the nature of the disability:

- Priority registration
- Exam and classroom accommodations
- Textbook and multimedia conversion
- Assistive technology training
- Scholarship information
- On-campus housing accommodations
- Transition, retention and graduation advising

Employee

Faculty and staff employees with disabilities may be eligible for one or more of the following resources depending on the nature of the disability:

- Job analysis/worksite assessment
- Reasonable accommodations
- Training/technical assistance on how to use reasonable accommodations and assistive technology

SF STATE ATI


